
Major Donor Award- Recognition for donation exceeding \$10,000:

Last Week's Program - Jack Bakeman Foundation Day

Ann Kennedy: Since 1994 Jack has educated this club about the Rotary Foundation. When Ann first became a member Jack informed her of the many Foundation programs, especially Polio Plus. Jack also promoted the Group Study Exchange and several of our club members have participated: Ann went to India, Sally Parks to Scotland, Julie Scales to Germany and Carole Owenby to the Caribbean as GSE leaders; Jonathan Skinner went as a GSE team member to Germany and became a team leader for one week of the trip. Martine Stapp has been chosen as an alternate to go to the Philippines next year.

Ray Kingsbury: We need team members for the GSE Philippine trip, ages 25-40 of no specific category of profession, however for the Turkey team we need educators. Ray introduced the visiting Rotary Leaders present to honor Jack: Herb Brown, past Rotary International President; Rus Miller, current District Governor; Roger Lacy, Asst. District Governor; Keith Kurber, past District Governor; Jared Brown, past District Governor.

Herb Brown: Herb praised Jack's part in making Dunedin Rotary Club a leader in Foundation contributions in the district. He spoke of the \$124 million raised for Polio Plus that brought in matching funds through the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation and other sources to total \$633 million. Herb spoke of meeting Nelson Mandela regarding his problems in getting every African

country to open their doors to Polio Plus. Mandela's involvement was crucial in making polio eradication programs available to most Africans. Herb also pointed to the success of the Group Study Exchange with 40,000 people participating over the years. He reminded us that the scholarship program, while being very worthwhile, does not bring in members to our clubs, as the GSE program does. Herb recounted his visit with India's president where he received permission to bring in polio eradication programs, thereby assuring the immunization of millions each year. Ray suggested that when someone asks, "What does Rotary do?" that we should reply with information about the Foundation and Polio Plus.

Presentation of Awards:

Paul Harris Awards: Named for Paul Harris, founder of Rotary. This award was established in 1977 in recognition of donations of \$1000 to the Rotary Foundation. These monies provide continued support of Rotary projects such as potable water, health and education.

Ann Kennedy gave a Paul Harris Award to the students of Dunedin High School Interact who raised \$1000 for Polio Plus last year, thanks to Lynn Smeraldo's leadership. Ann also recognized, Lindsay Nicole Bennett, president of Interact Club at Palm Harbor University High School for her humanitarian efforts. Andrew Fontaine, grandson of Ellis Rue, Steve Bennett accepted. Lynn Wargo received a Paul Harris Award for her generous contribution to the Rotary Foundation. Ray Kingsbury memorialized his father, Erdie Ray Kingsbury with a Paul Harris Award.
