

Last Week's Program – The Rotary Foundation

Gene Beil explained in detail the Foundation's categories of giving, and stressed that anyone can give- individual club members, clubs, non-Rotarians, and corporations. He also encouraged all members to promote the Foundation. The 3 different funds are: the **Restricted giving** where money is given for a specific purpose, such as Polio Plus (an important project for the past 20 years, leaving only 4 countries that still have this need); the **Permanent Fund** which is an endowment where the principle is not spent, but interest goes toward Rotary's work throughout the world; the **Annual Fund** which pays for all administrative costs of the Foundation (funds are held for 3 years and the interest pays the staff and office expenses). Gene stressed that there are no Rotary CEOs- money goes to good causes and none is wasted. The world fund is for GSE and District Designated Funds can be decided by the district, such as ambassadorial scholars. For more information, please visit:
