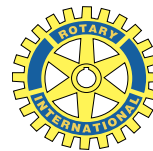

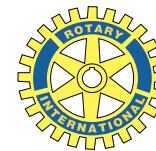

Club Foundaton Salutes Generous Donors

Ed Proefke, V.P. of the Dunedin Rotary Club Foundation was our speaker last week. Ed recognized those members who made gifts to our Club's Foundation in 2006 and talked with us about the works of our Club Foundation.

Thanks to the support of the generous Rotarians in our club the Foundation has a current Fund balance of \$366,462. These Funds are guided by several members of our Club who help to select appropriate investments and maintain compliance through charitable distributions. Each year the Foundation distributes 5% of the total fund balance to support local charitable endeavors such as the thousands of dollars in scholarships provided to local high school students. The contributions to and operations of the Foundation ultimately help the good works of our Club to go further longer.

There are four Partner Levels that are recognized in the Foundation. A Bronze Level Partner donates between \$1000 and \$4999 to the Foundation. Our Club has four Partners at this level, Jack Bakeman, Carl and Jane Keltner, Ernie Wartneburg and the newest Bronze Partner Bob Isham. Silver Level Partners are those who donate between \$5,000 and \$9,999 and Gold Partners have made donations that total between \$10,000 and \$24,999. Gold Level Partners are Frank McCombs and the Melba and Ron Rilott Endowed Scholarship Fund by Melba Rilott.
