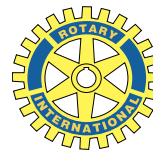

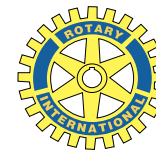

## MORNINGSTAR FISHERMAN REPORT

Pat McKee, Sergeant at Arms in Pasco County at the San Antonio Rotary Club and a volunteer with Morningstar Fisherman reported on Morningstar Fishermen. Pat's guests Raheem and Raymond are training at Morningstar and will take their education and put it to use in Africa. Morningstar Fishermen combine aquaculture and hydroponics. They were awarded a RI grant for Nicaragua. When they got there and the locals realized that they needed help. Two people who own a quarry pulled up with a truckload of sand and wouldn't let them pay AND then provided the workers with a free banquet.

Adopt a tank - they are adapting their tanks to facilitate Talapia and other fish. They are attempting to utilize all the components of fish to grow vegetables. The current tanks need repairs - including fixing sealants and components. If we sponsor a tank we will get A sign at the end of the tank. These tanks help to generate sales of all natural, antibiotic free products. Morningstar is non profit and provides scholarships. The cost is \$1,000 a tank and from April 1-28 all money is matched.

GSE teams are funded by the Rotary Foundation. This year will be a special with two teams going to NE Italy and Jamaica. Ann went to India, Jonathon and Julie to Germany and Sally to Scotland. Julie - In Germany/Bavaria. She said that many people are not aware of the difference between the East Germany and West Germany. They want a reunification, and one of the ways that this is happening is West Germans are charged an additional tax that goes to the East Germans. East Germany's outlook was vastly changed under Communism, including having no lawyers or CPAs. West Germany is much more Entrepreneurial! Ann - In North India. Very modern, she got to visit Lake Palace where Octopussy was filmed. The Rotarians that she met were very warm and friendly, especially the children. She visited the Taj Mahal. There were people who were very rich and very poor, and surprisingly to her, the poor ones were happy in their place and did not envy the rich ones. The

very rich were responsible for helping the poor - one rich family feeds 500 people a night after they have had their dinner. Jonathan went as a team member. Knew Sallie Parks prior to going, was very struck by the "Family" of Rotary. He toured Germany and was impressed by the warmth and welcome that he got everywhere. Sallie - Scotland. She got there the day after Princess Diana died. She watched the funeral at the first home that she stayed at and cried with owners. She was also there as the Labor Party Prime Minister was elected into government.

There is a competition among the District to see who will get to be a team leader. There is little expense and it is an opportunity to learn about other people and cultures and is a wonderful growing experience. Members of the team represent many different professions. One thing that was interesting to the ladies is that the "older" clubs do not admit women, but the new clubs that have started recently do!
