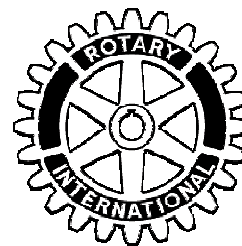

Rotary spotlight – Ray Kingsbury

Last Week's Program – Bob Gibbs Miles for Hope

Bob Gibbs shared his story of a young person diagnosed with brain cancer who was not



eligible to receive the experimental vaccine now available until late in his treatment. Bob was VP of a construction company before he was diagnosed with brain cancer five years ago.

The disease has caused his blindness, but has not damaged his fighting spirit. He credits his survival with going to a brain center in California and

advises his listeners to tell anyone who has brain cancer to do the same. He feels that if he had received the vaccine (formulated especially for him from his own cancer cells) he would not have lost his eyesight. Bob also feels that his life has been spared so that he can do the work of raising money for brain cancer victims who need the special treatment provided by the centers in California, New York and North Carolina. Statistically it is probable that 1 million people are walking around with brain cancer but don't know it. Bob advocates for early detection through MRIs on a regular basis, and feels that insurance companies should fund this procedure as it does other screening tests.
