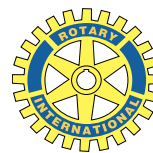

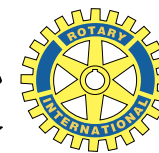

Pinellas Community Foundation Manages \$69 Million Benefitting Thousands of Pinellas Citizens Each Year

The Pinellas Community Foundation has been serving the needs of non-profit organizations and philanthropic donors in this area since 1969. The Foundation is one of the oldest Community Foundations in Florida, and currently oversees \$69 million in assets, allocated among more than 90 donor created funds.

Last week the Foundation’s Executive Director, our fellow Club member, City Commissioner Julie Scales spoke to our Club about how the Foundation operates and the opportunities it provides for donors, non-profit organizations and the Pinellas community as a whole.

Commissioner Scales said the Foundation is a ‘give through’ organization that helps donors support a specific organization or cause. The Foundation does not

compete with local non-profits to raise funds, but rather works with them to help facilitate a donor’s wishes to provide philanthropic support.

The Foundation currently holds more than 90 specific funds, and each fund can be classified into one of six different structures according to the preference of the donor.

- Restricted Funds are those that go to benefit a specific charity selected by the donor.

- Unrestricted Funds include gifts made by donors who do not specify which charity or cause they would like to support. These Unrestricted Funds provide support in the areas of housing, children, elderly, health care, women, family services and animal welfare and others.

- Field of Interest Funds are used when a donor would like to support a specific cause, but does not choose to provide that support through any one organization. This type of Fund allows the Foundation to engage in a competitive grant process to select which specific non-profit should receive funding. Field of Interest Funds are currently available for the environment, public broadcasting, and social and human services.

- Donor Advised Funds give the donor the ability to choose how charitable distributions are made. These funds are governed by an agreement between the donor and Foundation and by the Foundation’s Guidelines for Donor Advised Funds. Commissioner Scales said that these funds have gotten quite popular in the last 10-20 years, and while they work much like a Family Foundation they are free from many of the restrictions and reporting requirement associated with individual family foundations.

- Scholarship Funds allow donors to support the educational endeavors of Pinellas County students. The Foundation currently oversees eight of these Funds and in 2006 awarded \$141,570.71 in total scholarships.

- Agency Endowment Funds help non-profits to create ongoing revenue streams to help support their efforts. The Foundation currently holds Endowments to benefit 22 different non-profit organizations.

In 2006 the Pinellas Community Foundation, through the generosity of its donors, provided more than \$2 million in support to the Pinellas Community and continues to help ‘Build a Better Future for Pinellas County.’
