GIVE BLOOD!

Julia Linn is *Director of Donor Services* for the *Florida Blood Bank*. She is responsible for recruiting 750 units of blood daily. Today, Pinellas County is the third largest transfusion market in the US.

By the age of 70, nine out of ten of us will need some sort of blood products in our lifetime, but only 5% of the eligible people donate blood. If everyone who is eligible donates twice a year, we will never have a blood shortage. Today, they have to have 192,000 good blood units a year to meet the need for Pinellas, Hillsborough, Pasco and Manatee counties..
